### What is One Community?

*The Interfaith Conference of Greater Milwaukee is launching a new project titled One Community to address regional racial and economic segregation from a faith perspective. This will engage selected urban and suburban faith communities in examining the history and the root causes of the social challenges our metro area faces.*

### What Makes This Different from Other Conversations About Race and Economics?

*We want to create a united, faith-based, regional constituency within the next two years to advocate with legislators and other officials for at least one structural change to address the economic and racial divide in the region.*

### What Will Happen in the Faith Community Dialogues?

*The focus of the faith community dialogues will be to inform faith community members about racial and economic segregation in a way that is honest and open while allowing participants to be reflective and vulnerable in a safe and respectful environment. The model for these discussions is the successful Amazing Faiths conversations sponsored by the Interfaith Conference.*
